Friday the 5. August, 2016 was a very significant day in NLAI because we celebrated turning the "first layer of soil" for the building of the new boys home.




most vulnerable. Therefore, they were very excited that we now are building a boys home with room for at least 80 boys.

New Life Africa Garment Making School

At New Life Africa Garment Making School young girls receive four years of training that concludes with a State Examination. Many of these young girls come from an environment without anyone to help them to start a course. Consequently girls often end up in premature marriages or pregnancies.

This training enables them to become self-employed or employed as seamstresses and designers.

Because of the rather few sponsors for the garment school it has been a heavy financial burden to run the school, especially with the extended 4-year program in which students become designers and seamstresses.

The Kavli Foundation

We are very grateful that The Kavli Foundation in Norway will financially support 35 students at the garment school for a period of 4 years. This will help us a lot at NLAI.

When women are financially independent and are able to contribute to the family, they earn respect in the household and in the commu-



nity and are able to raise their voices against injustices. This results into happier families and communities. Research has shown that when women have more resources, more development happens in a community. This is because women will invest in their children and the future to a larger

degree than men will. The tendency in marginalized areas is that a man will spend more money on himself/alcohol. This is certainly a project worth supporting.

now has every good opportunity to take care of herself. It pleases us every time young people get that far in life.
