


Construction of the new Boys Home



The construction of the new Boys House is progressing well and soon the roof will be fitted. The walls have been built and windows have been installed. Floors have been laid and the bathrooms and the daily room are currently being paved with tiles. The boys eagerly follow how the construction is moving along and they

look forward to the day when they can occupy their new home. It will be the new home for the 44 boys who are currently living at the home. Furthermore, it will be an



opportunity to accommodate another 40 boys who are in need of a new home. Beyond any doubt, this home will be of great help and a blessing to innumerable boys in the future.

We have now finally reached the goal for the actual construction. We are deeply grateful to God and to all of you who have donated money for this new building and made this project possible. Thank you so much for your great help and may God bless you. Even though big funds have been raised, there is still a need for some things to be financed. The next challenge is to finance the following: kitchen tools and equipment, furniture for the living room, tables and chairs for the dining hall, beds for the dormitories and laundry

machines. The estimated cost of all of this is approximately USD 46450.

If you want to support the purchase of these items, please mark your payment **"inventory for the Boys House."** We expect to install a solar heating system for hot water to accommodate the boys with warm water for their showers. The solar heating capacity is for 80 people at an estimated cost of USD 17850.

At the beginning of December 2016 a nationally youth camp was held here in Nakuru by the FPFK (the Christian organization we cooperate with in Kenya). The NLAI School buildings were used as dormitories and the Filadelfia Church facilitated the meetings. 700 young people from all of Kenya gathered together for a week of fellowship, bible teaching and worship. Our teenagers and young people from NLAI homes joined the camp and had a wonderful and inspiring week together with all the rest

by singing and sharing their testimonies. They learned a lot about mission and assisted wherever help was needed.

The NLAI School

The School runs well. The children have returned from their Christmas holiday and are now continuing school with exciting

classes, as well as drama, music, dance and many sports activities. They are very creative and they love sports and scouting which they are very much into. In addition to the beginning of two new nursery classes, many children have started school and



are filling in the vacant places in the classes. They have all had their photo taken, which will be sent to their sponsors within a



few months. All the children were very thankful to receive new uniforms, cardigans, socks, shoes and bags. The NLAI school choir is making great progress and we have already enjoyed their singing very much. They also sing together with the NLAI band that mainly consists of boys from the orphanage. They are capable and are now playing at many events at the school and the church.

We are in need of new tables and chairs for the 8th class as the old ones are worn out. Unfortunately, we cannot get chairs and tables from Denmark anymore because of huge Kenyan customs duties. We hope to be able to collect the amount of USD 2150 to cover the cost of chairs and tables for approx. 50 students, which is approx \$ 43 per student. The NLA Tumaini School

Everything is well at this school, near the dumpsite. 22 new children began nursery school in January 2017 when the new school

year began in Kenya. Each day 64 children attend school receiving education as well as uniforms, shoes, food and care. One of the girls, who



is in the middle class, had problems with her legs and needed a knee operation. Her sponsor paid for this and now the girl is happy and soon she will be able to walk. As she lives at the dumpsite it made her need even greater. Thank you so much for the extra gift for this lovely girl.

NLAI supports children from other schools

There are 131 students attending different primary schools who

are supported by NLAI and thus receive things that they need such as uniforms, bags and food. Some of the stu-



dents attend boarding school because it is too risky for them to stay at home at the dumpsite.

Further education

Seven out of eight students, who graduated high school in November 2016, have qualified for further education based on their marks and the NLAI's rules for support of various education. At present, they follow an IT course as a preparation for further studies.

Now 38 students are studying at high school or university and some of them will graduate this year.

Veronicah has started her education in Fashion & design.

Monica has succesfully completed her education in management and accountancy.
